Note: Kindly note that the timeline is tentative and subject to change.

ELIGIBILITY:

- The submission is open to all Law Students registered in Graduate/Post Graduate Course in any Institution/ College/ University.
- The students can register themselves as a team of 2 or may also seek single registration.
- There is no restriction on the number of entries from any college or university.
- The participants shall write a single opinion. Multiple opinions/dissenting opinions are not allowed.

FORMAT GUIDELINE:

- Language- The language for writing the judgment shall be in **English** only.
- Word limit – Maximum of 5000 words (including foot notes).
- Main Text – Times New Roman, font size 12, double spacing, justified, with a margin of an inch on all sides.
- Footnotes – Times New Roman, font size 10. Substantive footnotes are accepted.
- Citation Mode – Any uniform method of citation is allowed.
- Page numbers must be at the bottom center.

SUBMISSION PROCEDURE:

- A cover page stating the name of the competition, the name of participant's institution and the names of student author, with the signature of student author.

- The Judgment Writing shall begin on the next page. The first page of Judgment must contain Team Code, Name of the Court, Title, Number of the Case, Date of Delivery of Judgment, Nature of the Case (Civil/Criminal/Writ).
- Do not state any matter in the judgment (except the cover page) that might reveal your identity or of your institution.
- All the Judgments must be saved and sent as PDF file. The title of the file must be in the following format CPUH_JWC_ TEAM CODE.
- The participants who register for the event shall be provided with a Unique Registration Code which shall be used for all further communication and submission of the write-up.
- The write-ups shall have no plagiarism and should be the original work of the participants.
- The write-up must be submitted in both Microsoft Word and PDF format.
- The write-up must be sending on Google form link. (The link will be shared on 23 Feb 2021 by E-Mail)

2nd NATIONAL JUDGMENT WRITING COMPETITION, 2021

Proposition

DISCLAIMER: The facts stated in the present case are fictitious and have been drafted solely for the purposes of the competition. The facts, names, locations and dates bear no resemblance to any person, event or happening whether dead or alive. Any resemblance, if any found is purely co-incidental. No additional evidence or additional witness testimonies (other than provided) can be brought on record by any team for the purposes of the competition. Failure to adhere to the same will result in disqualification. The names used in the case are purely for the purposes of the competition. No real incidences are to be attached with them. This problem does not intend to hurt the feelings of any section of the society or to offend any person.

- 1) Mr. Vinod at 11.00 am. on Monday, June 6th the managing director of ABC Ltd., sent a telegram (Telegram App) msg to Mr. Teji Singh, a casual friend, offering to sell him a JCB loader for 60,000 Rs.
- 2) Mr. Vinod promised that he would keep this offer open to him till 7th June 2020 till 9:00 pm.
- 3) On next Morning Mr. Teji Singh telegram to Mr. Vinod that I want the JCB loader you offered to me for my company work.
- 4) Mr. Teji Singh sends address on telegram where his company was located last. Worried for the delayed message delivered on telegram also Mr. Teji Singh didn't mention correct address; Mr. Teji Singh subsequently sends a telegram accepting the offer at 9:00 p.m. on morning of June 7th, 2020.
- 5) However, on 8th June Mr. Vinod accepted an offer from a third party and sold his JCB loader to them.
- 6) Mr. Vinod had arrived late from work that day and fails to check his telegram. During the day he confirms the offer of 40,000 Rs. for the JCB loader from third party
- 7) Mr Vinod telegram the revocation to Mr. Teji Singh at 5.30 p.m. on the evening of June 6th
- 8) Mr. Teji Singh's phone had no internet connection owing to the government rule for blocking the internet connection between 6.00 p.m. to 10.00 a.m.
- 9) Mr Teji Singh receives the revocation from Mr. Vinod at 10.00 a.m. on Wednesday, June 8th

- 10) Mr. Teji Singh receives Mr. Vinod telegram at 10.30 a.m. on the same day, June 8th. Mr. Vinod refuses to sell the JCB loader to Mr. Teji Singh.
- 11) Mr. Teji Singh suffer a loss for his new start up business by not taking the JCB loader from Mr. Vinod because Mr. Teji Singh has paid 50000 Rs. as an advance money to Mr. Rahul construction associate on 6th June who has been appointed to do the work for Mr. Teji Singh 's new start up business.
- 12) Mr. Teji Singh has also given the contract to Mr. Rahul to re-construct the old office for new start up business. On 6th June afternoon Mr. Teji Singh has also given the order of all necessary items which is required for re-constructing the office for new start up and the items shall be delivered by 7th June to Mr. Teji Singh. Due to the revocation of the proposal by Mr. Vinod, Mr. Teji Singh has suffered a loss of 80000 Rs of the ordered items.
- 13) Mr. Teji Singh want's the compensation of 1,30000 from Mr. Vinod on for breach of contract, which Mr. Teji Singh has to pay to Mr. Rahul and the amount spent on the items by Mr. Teji Singh for new start up.
